Island Timberlands LP (Island) is committed to the sustainable production of timber that meets our customers' needs over the long term. Island is committed to achieving and maintaining sustainable forest management on our timberlands and using the Company's Timberlands Management System to manage operations including planning, road development, harvesting, transportation, log handling, maintenance, facilities, reforestation, and silviculture.

Island's forest management activities will:

- Use and promote responsible practices to protect key environmental values such as fish habitat and water resources, soils and soil productivity, long term forest health and productivity, critical wildlife habitat, species at risk, special sites, biological diversity;
- Respect cultural, historical, recreation and aesthetic values;
- Optimize recovery and utilization in forest harvesting;
- Follow sound planning, road building, harvesting and forestry standards; and
- Be subject to periodic review through transparent audit processes and third party certification.

Island is committed to:


- Continuous improvement in forest management and environmental performance, through support of research, training and education;
- Recycling and preventing pollution associated with our operations, practices, and facilities;
- Complying with applicable laws and regulations and other requirements to which the company subscribes that relate to our forest and environmental management;

- Considering feedback from the public, encouraging public involvement and responding to public health and environmental impacts of our operations;
- Responsible fibre sourcing practices that support sustainability principles;
- Ensuring that its personnel and contractors are competent to fulfill their responsibilities; and
